Income Requirements for California Medicaid. When it comes to meeting the income requirements, you have to be a member of a low-income household. The exact amount is determined by the income of the household as well as by the number of family members in said household. The income of the household cannot go over 138% of what your family's size is based on the Federal Poverty Level.

### Medicaid Eligibility Income Chart by State - Updated Feb. 2020

In 2019, California enacted SB104, which extends Medicaid eligibility to young adults (ages 19-25) who are eligible based on their income, regardless of their immigration status. So Medi-Cal is now available to young adults in California with income up to \$17,609 for a single person, and up to \$29,974 for a household of three.

Medicaid benefits eligibility in California begins with the income requirements established by the federal government. Generally, anybody who is eligible for Medicaid will be considered low-income or very low-income.

Income requirements: You're eligible for Medi-Cal if you make between \$16,395 (for a family of one) and \$79,392 (for a family of 12) a year. Larger families can add \$5,741 per individual to their yearly salary.

### Seniors & Medicare and Medicaid Enrollees | Medicaid

A home equity cap of \$750,000 is in place for those applying to Medi-Cal, and anyone with a home valued above this cap cannot qualify for long-term care coverage. The cap only applies to applicants seeking long-term care - those applying for basic coverage are not subject to any home equity limits.
