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### Theories Of Change Conflict Resolution

A number of basic methods for bringing about change that is likely to lead in the direction of conflict resolution or transformation suggest themselves: 1. changing leaders; 2. changing leaders' and followers' minds; 3. changing strategies, policies and behaviour; 4. changing parties' environments.

### Conflict, Change and Conflict Resolution

Two central conflict resolution theories are the Thomas-Kilman Conflict Mode Instrument (TKI) and the Interest Based Relational (IBR) Approach. The theory of TKI is that there are particular modes of dealing with conflict, and each is suited to different kinds of disputes. IBR puts forth a set of conflict resolution rules that should be used with any dispute.

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A conflict can be resolved through logical approach or the emotional approach . the basic difference between avoiding and preventing the conflict is that preventing refers to use of precautions in order to keep a person away from conflict whereas avoidance means not to take care of the consequences and letting the conflict to grow rather than acting in the manner to prevent the conflict.
